Appropriations Committee in terms of recommending this override. And I would encourage our members...and also, the community health center in south Omaha does wonderful work, works with this population of individuals that are lacking health insurance, keeps them off the Medicaid rolls, keeps them out of the emergency rooms, as Senator Stuthman indicated. I would very much endorse this override provision, endorse the work of the Appropriations Committee and strongly encourage members of the Legislature to follow the recommendations of your Appropriations Committee. Thank you, Senator Cudaback, and thank you, Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki. On with discussion. Senator Byars, followed by Senator Janssen.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. President. I stand in strong support of the Appropriation's recommendation to override this veto. Colleagues, these are dollars that aren't an expense but they're an investment in the healthcare of the poorest in our state. And this is an investment that will come back to us 10, 100 times over in the reduction in the need for very expensive treatment for many of these individuals in the future. This is an investment. I want to thank the Appropriations Committee. I think what they have done is absolutely the right thing in advocating for us to override this veto. And I would yield any additional time that I have to Senator Pederson if he would like it.

But someone is going to have to pay for that. So if we don't have these centers the people can use, they are going to get that medical treatment
