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LB 500, 1105

SENATOR STUHR: All right. I was told that actually it was only the amount of ticket sales, maybe concessions, food generated within and at the Qwest Center, so that is...that is not correct then.

SENATOR LANDIS: That's right. There's a maximum multiplier number of two, but the board that operates this system is to set that based on economic analysis, and we're operating with a multiplier of 1.6 now, so that is being used.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. Another question, because you mentioned board, and I also saw in the amendments. Who is this board that you are indicating? (Laugh)

SENATOR LANDIS: Not fair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, would you yield?

SENATOR LANDIS: The board, I just had to ask George because I was confirming it, and I was right, oddly enough, the Governor, State Treasurer, and the chairman of the Investment Council, which, by the way, will be the same board that we're going to suggest to you to use in LB 500 a little bit later.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. I'm sorry.

SENATOR STUHR: I'll turn the rest of the time back to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Sorry I interrupted you. No further discussion? No lights on? Senator Brashear, you're recognized to close on your amendment.
