running around here who are on the payroll of OPS saying they oppose this. They don't even live in the community, a lot of them. You never hear of them unless they're trying to get people to support them for some kind of award or other given by white people. Senator Kruse said teachers and principals are offended with the idea of giving local control in the community where the children are failing. Are you surprised? Why are they failing? The teachers and the principals. If there is accountability demanded, they may have to either cut the mustard or cut a trail, and that's what they don't want. When they had so-called magnet schools, they were in the middle of the black community, but the neighborhood where those schools were placed the children could not attend, and their parents were told these schools are not for the black children, they're to bring in white children. And I have somebody who works with me who tried to get her son into a magnet school, so I know what I'm talking about. And I live in the black community and I've always lived there, and when some of these Negroes come to you, ask them where do they live and where do their children go to school. What Senator Bourne and these other people are saying, when they suggest that my amendment creates segregation when the segregation is already there, you know what that's like saying? Well, Ernie, we got a lot of water here, but you're making the water wetter. Making water wetter? The segregation is here. It's due to the policies and practices of OPS. If Senator Bourne, on his high, self-righteous hobbyhorse means what he says, how can he deny that the deliberate segregation of the schools by OPS is not state action and violating the constitution in Brown v. Board, but he's carrying water for OPS. He doesn't care about black children who are being cheated. That's the thing. These children are being cheated. And he can casually say, well, we need to do something about that, then run right past it and say, but we cannot suggest doing what I'm talking about. You all know, who've been down here any time, how much I fought for all...
