fighting before I was even married and going to school to help other people with their children, the same problems that were there when my children were in school, and in fact they were there when I attended OPS, are there now. So since the segregation has not been significantly reduced, the same problems of failure have not been corrected or ameliorated, how can I stand here knowing that these children finish school and cannot read? That's what this Legislature should be upset about. That's what these people carrying water for OPS should be talking about. But if it's not talked about me, who talks about it? Then you want to pretend, well, don't listen to him; he doesn't know. I live it every day. And I have parents who come to me every day. They don't have computers so they can send out these canned e-mails that OPS arranged. They don't have a bunch of rich white men who will stand up for them. But you'll notice, brothers and sisters, friends, enemies, and neutrals, they have all the rich white men in one press conference, then the next day they had a ragtag, bobtail, so-called...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...multicultural group having another press conference to attack me in what I'm doing. Why didn't they all get together, since they're supposed to be following a common course, and show how this diversity and multiculturalism works by using it in their own life, in their own program? But do you think these rich white men are going to have these kind of people who were at that second press conference coming to a room where they are? And they're the ones extolling diversity? You all can buy it. You all can be frightened off. You all may have people who want some business deals and some things through the Legislature, so you will go along with them, and I can't stop you from doing that. But I'm going to put things in the record and I'm going to show how much hypocrisy is here by these people who talk about my amendment causing segregation, and they're not concerned or disturbed by the segregation in public schools and OPS now...
