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Thursday. But here's an intriguing idea, too. Well, actually let me step back. Here is what we have with Senator Chambers' amendment attached and no reconsider. You've got northeast, you've got south, you've got west Omaha. You've got Ralston, you've got Westside, you've got Bennington, you've got Elkhorn, you've got Millard. I just counted eight districts within Douglas County right there. Here's an intriguing idea, okay, and I presented this to Senator Raikes on a napkin or something over there a long time ago. I said this is interesting, let's talk about this. You take Douglas County, you go from the Missouri River and you go all the way out to the Elkhorn River. And you divide it into three quadrants. And you say here is your north local district, here is your central local district, and here is your south local district. And then you say, guess what Omaha South and folks that live in that area? You're teaming up with Millard South and you're teaming up with Millard West. That's resource sharing, that is, I believe, creating in the context of learning communities what we thought we would have. I'm just throwing up a hypothetical. Let's go the central unit. Let's go to Central High on the east side over by the river. And then let's go out to Burke High and then let's go west to Millard North. That's an intriguing thought. Hey, here's another one. On the north side, let's go to North High, let's go to Northwest, and let's gobble up Bennington. Let's make that the north quadrant. Why is that any different than what we're doing here? Would that create ire? Would it create angst? Absolutely. Why are we surprised by an amendment like this creating ire and angst? It should. My point is this. Anything we do is going to create that, but there are a lot of intriguing ideas that we could come up with. Senator Chambers came up with an intriguing idea the other day. We spent two hours and we adopted it. In my opinion, I just gave you another one. That sounds just as intriguing as what Senator Chambers promoted, to me. Look, I don't know if I'm promoting it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR FRIEND: I don't even know where to go with an idea like that. But why don't we try? Here's where we're at right now. I believe we're overreaching. More than likely there will be a lawsuit in the interim. To adjudicate something like that, it
