reproductions of races that took place. And when I say a reproduction, I mean it would have to be done by camera. I don't think they had videotape that long ago based on when some of these races would be brought back to life. Nobody knows whether these are on the up-and-up. Nobody knows whether those machines can be manipulated. There are people who will go into casinos. And if there's a roulette wheel, they can't figure how there can be any cheating because if that ball is going around and around and the wheel is spinning, there's no way that the person operating that wheel can cheat. But there is. Any time there's gambling, there is a built-in method for cheating. This is not something that will be a benefit to the state. It will further exacerbate the problem that Senator McDonald has been trying to address in a very limited fashion, because that's all the money that's available, but nevertheless has been trying to address. The Legislature has responded, not to the extent it should in terms of the amount of money that would really make an impact, but...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the Legislature has responded. And it is totally contradictory and nonsensical to, on the one hand, acknowledge the existence of a compulsive gambling problem and, on the other, turn around and create an alluring type of gambling that will appeal to those who are the victims of compulsive gambling. There is nothing meritorious enough about this bill being offered to us that overcomes all of the negatives. So I hope you will vote for my motion to bracket this bill until April 11. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Discussion? Senator Stuthman, followed by Senator Jensen.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. As Senator Synowiecki said, this is my priority bill. And the reason that I selected this bill for my priority bill is because there is a horse track in Columbus, the Columbus Races. At this track we have live racing, we have simulcasting. What we're trying to do, what the tracks are trying to do is have this historical racing. In my opinion, it is not a slot
