SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuthman, who will benefit most directly from this bill? And I'm not talking about the players of the game. Where will the money go?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Senator Chambers, the money that is generated, which is a certain percent of the money that is bet,...
