SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: You know, I'm such a good gambler, Senator Stuthman, that I don't really understand what parimutuel wagering means. I know that if you bet \$2, you have a 10 to 1 chance of winning. And that's about the extent of my racing ability.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay, I'll explain to you of what the betting portion of horse racing is. You bet. You bet \$5 to win, place, or show, or whatever you want to do, and that goes into a pool. As you see at the tracks, you'll have the win pool, the place pool, the show pool. You're betting that that horse is going to win or place or show. Those dollars, those dollars are the ones that are divided up after that percentage is taken off. And that's the same thing, that's the same situation that we have in
