SENATOR CHAMBERS: Were there people connected with the horse racing industry?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Horse...people with the horse racing industry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If...okay. If this bill were to be brought back to your committee, would there be time to conduct a hearing and process the bill?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You wouldn't have time? How many days are left in the session?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Three.
