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are those that testified in opposition to the bill, and it is my understanding, in visiting with them and their representatives, that they were actually in support of the bill at this time. So I would encourage your adoption of AM3232, the committee amendments, and the advancement of the bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. You've heard the opening on AM3232. Open for discussion. Senator Engel, followed by Senator Cunningham and five others.

SENATOR ENGEL: Mr. President and members of the body, I just have a question of Senator Erdman. Senator Erdman, in most schools, there's an academic requirement before you can participate in sports and so forth...or, many of them are.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR ENGEL: I mean, how do you come up with a record, especially for the homeschool...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ENGEL: ...children in this?

SENATOR ERDMAN: It's a fair question, Senator Engel. That provision that was in the underlying bill was actually struck from the bill. The committee amendment in the bill before us actually only requires that there be allowed to attend for the purposes of education. And so the purpose of enrollment, in order for them to be able to meet those standards, they would have to meet the current NSAA standards. This bill doesn't specifically address that. It just simply allows that the student has the opportunity to enroll in public school courses for the academic side of it.

SENATOR ENGEL: For the academic side of it. But as far as extracurricular activities, they're not...I mean, isn't that part of your bill?

SENATOR ERDMAN: It is not at this point. It would be my intent
