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offering a reconsideration motion unless she goes along with the segregation in the Omaha Public Schools and wants to be sure that black people have nothing to say about what happens to the children in their district. Senator Bourne should know, if he doesn't, that the minority population in Lincoln is nothing like that in Omaha. The same kind of problems that exist in Omaha do not exist in Lincoln. It is what OPS has put into motion that brought us all here, not what Lincoln or any other school district has done. So the attempt at child psychology that Senator Bourne unleashed demonstrates one thing. Child psychology, people should realize, doesn't even work on children, so how is it going to work on a thoughtful legislator such as Senator Beutler? But Senator Bourne wanted to make a point and people attempt that during the session at various junctures. I handed out an article which shows you how uninformed those big shots are who spoke against my proposal Saturday. David Sokol made the comment that the schools in Omaha are not segregated. Even Senator Bourne acknowledged that. And he's trying to help OPS, but he's not denying the reality. He's saying I've identified the right problem but I'm offering the wrong solution. What Mr. Sokol is saying, there's no need for a solution because there's no problem. Well, I want you all to know that three of the rascals who were there Saturday, David Sokol, Michael Yanney, and Walter Scott, are the three who welshed on paying the fines that were imposed by the Accountability and Disclosure Commission because of violations they committed. They will not pay those fines. They know the statute of limitations has run out. That's the kind of honor they do not have. So, while showing themselves to be dishonorable, to have been in violation of state laws, they're not going to make that right, but they're going to try to jump into a situation about which they know nothing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So my interest is in quality education for all children, and that's what my amendment would take us to. But in the meantime, so that we have some kind of orderly proceeding in my view, and I think the first step will be taken, we should defeat Senator Cornett's motion. And for that reason, I'm not going to have anything else to say while her motion is
