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impacts your school districts and yet on a wink and a nod and a trust me you're going to vote it over to Select File. You have no clue what's in the bill. We haven't...and that's because we haven't had the discussion. The discussion has been mired down in boundaries and racial implications and things of that nature and bashing OPS and bashing Millard and talking about what all bad actors they are, and we haven't discussed the bill. How can you in all good conscience, with all responsibility vote for cloture when you don't know what this bill is going to do to your school district?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion. Senator Cornett, followed by Senator Landis.

SENATOR CORNETT: Senator Chambers, would you be willing to yield to a question? Is Senator Chambers in the Chamber?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Is Senator Chambers on the floor? Yes, he is. Do you yield, Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CORNETT: Senator Chambers, earlier when you were speaking, you stated that I really had nothing to do with a minority district. Am I correct basically?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, you didn't hear the context of it. I said that if...

SENATOR CORNETT: Okay, I only caught part of it so let me...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Say it again.

SENATOR CORNETT: I only caught part of it so please refresh me.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I had said that if Senator Bourne is saying that Senator Beutler ought not vote for cloture because he doesn't want this perhaps in Lincoln, then he ought to say that you have nothing to do with this issue because you don't live in Omaha or that you don't care about minority students.
