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I think maybe there's a little bit in this body today about being vindictive and getting back. I don't think we want to go there, but I do urge you to stand by your convictions. I think that's very important, and I think we're seeing that today. What are we really doing with LB 1024? We are making important decisions that we need to look at and make sure what we're doing is right when we go ahead with what happens in LB 1024. But what are we really doing? We're making learning communities, and there's nothing that we can't back up from, like LB 126, and I appreciate the comments that Senator Flood had, that there are things in LB 126 that are taking effect that we didn't realize that was going to be there. And that is the one bad thing about LB 126 and the concerns that I had. But I'm backing away from that, and we are talking about LB 1024 right now, and if you look at LB 1024 right now and the way it's set up and the time lines, there's nothing that we can't back away from. We're making learning communities; we are not changing boundaries. The only thing that's going to take effect in '08-'09 is the tax structure part of it. There needs to be a plan developed by July of '07, by July 31 of '07 the plan needs to be implemented, but there's nothing in LB 1024, unlike LB 126, that we can't back up and address later. I think we've got everybody to the table right now, we're talking, we've got good discussion. I think it's important that we go ahead with this discussion and talk. The one thing that is going to end, if this doesn't go to Select File, is discussion, and everybody is going to go back to their little corners and do their own thing. We need to move this bill to Select File so that we continue this discussion, and that we can keep everybody to the table and talking, because if we don't do that, we gain nothing. I will be voting for cloture, and I hope to have another discussion on Select File. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Heidemann. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, and I want to thank Senator Landis for his analysis, and I visited with him about what I think the end game could be. And I don't believe Select File is the end game, because I think what we will see is what we saw after last
