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SENATOR FRIEND: Now, with that, what I would say, I would yield the rest of that...remainder of that time. And I know Senator Pedersen has his light pushed. You're welcome to the rest of the time, Senator Pedersen, if you'd like.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Pedersen.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. By adopting this amendment, you're using consequences with...as a tool to help cure. You need consequences, as I said the last time I spoke on this bill. But just to be punitive does not help change. Consequences that lead somebody to change is what this does. We need more work on this, and I'll be looking at that next year, God willing, if I'm here. And I appreciate your support for this amendment. Thanks.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Friend. You've heard the opening on the motion to return. Before we go to discussion, the cookies are being passed out in honor of Senator Patrick "Faber" Bourne's 50th birthday. As you can see, he cleaned up pretty well to come here to the Legislature. So congratulate Senator Bourne. (Applause) We wish you (continued applause)...time. Discussion of the Friend amendment. Senator Dwite Pedersen. Senator Pedersen waives. Senator Synowiecki. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. What a tribute that was. Thank you. (Laughter) I just...I want to clarify, I'm going to support both the motion to return and the amendment. I appreciate Senator Friend's work. I just want to lay out a little bit of intent. So if...my understanding of the amendment is, if it's over .16 on a first offense, the suspension that will occur is a 30-day hard suspension, and then the individual is eligible for a work permit or an interlock after that time period. I just wanted to lay out that intent. With that, I will support both the motion and the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: No further lights on. Senator Friend, do you wish to close on your motion to return? He does not wish to
