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SENATOR LANDIS: I'll be happy to say what I mean, in that case, if you'd like.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Edgar Bergen, please. And let us leave Charlie McCarthy out of this,...

SENATOR LANDIS: Fair enough.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because he can speak for himself. Okay, I think I'm following now.

SENATOR LANDIS: It is exactly as you say it. What we do now is, we go through a ritual,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Um-hum.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...and it's a perverse ritual, because it claims areas that you...that the common man would never say is blighted and substandard, but we find a way to call it blighted and substandard so we could use, then, this financing tool.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, in fairness to Senator Connealy, he did discuss around that. But I think that I was viewing the bill within the context of what I thought the one-liner was saying.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the one-liner is not really an accurate or full disclosure of what this particular proposal would do.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: I think that would be a fair characterization.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Senator Connealy, I'd like to ask you a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Connealy.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Yes.
