SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Any further discussion? Seeing none, Senator Beutler, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'd waive closing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: He waives closing. The question is, shall AM3073 be adopted? All in favor vote aye; opposed, nay. Voting on adoption of the Beutler amendment, AM3073. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Beutler amendment has been adopted.

CLERK: Senator Beutler, I now have AM3074.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Clerk, I'd ask to substitute AM3143 for AM3074, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Objection? So ordered.

CLERK: Three one what, Senator? I'm sorry. AM3143, got it. Thank you. (Legislative Journal page 1591.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, this amendment applies to Section 3(a) that Senator Baker was just talking about. Section 3 has to do with those items that are not affected by the general rule in the bill, with respect to the use of eminent domain, and one of those exceptions are public projects or private projects that make the property available for use by the general public. And again, this is a kind of technical amendment, trying to make a little more clear and distinguish a little bit more what is meant here. And it would say...it would change the language to say public projects
