It's not published as an opinion as, you know, through an appellate It essentially said that the court in that case dismissed all counts due to lack of standing, meaning the court said the plaintiffs did not have the correct legal standing to bring their case. And they said that decision making regarding the education of illegal aliens at the postsecondary level is best left to the U.S. Congress and to the Kansas legislature. I think, together with the other federal opinions that I've cited here, that the U.S. Congress decides what type of immigration policy we have in this nation. We have a lot of folks that don't agree with it. I think that's telling. I don't want this bill to be filibustered. I think it deserves an up or down vote, but I do think that this is dangerous ground when you start talking about overruling or sidestepping or crafty legislation to do indirectly what we can't do directly. already says 180 days in Nebraska, in Chapter 85, and...180 days, and that's telling right there. I say we sit back, let's see what the federal government does and come at it again when we can make a decision as to where we're going with this after the federal government has weighed in.
