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get it. The coordinating council, the learning community is just an excellent one, part of it because it's so slow paced. It takes them two years to come to anything. Fine. That's what we need, and that gives us a chance to respond back. Senator Landis was looking for a negotiated settlement here. Well, that's what we're doing sometimes, but this isn't negotiation, folks. This is not negotiation. We are being parents with unruly children, and the first thing you do is get order in the room. If we do nothing, we have chaos, continuing chaos. We already have it. We are in a spot where we must have a coordinating council, and I think it's just an excellent setup because it is slow paced and so broad-based. The learning community can bring wisdom and consultation and plans before us. So we must have a group where everybody has to come to the table. Number two, this doesn't get very complicated, there's only two basic requirements as I see it, number two, we must freeze the boundaries or that's all they'll talk about. Again, please help us freeze the boundaries so that we can talk about education. Now I trust this group to do it. We have wonderful educators in the metro Omaha community. These persons can do it if we simply be the parent, get them into a room so that it can happen that way. If we do not, I see it as chaos. Someone suggested that we've gone too far (laugh). Hello. We haven't gone anyplace yet. I urge that we bring the players to the table. Senator Smith spoke of...spoke very well of an anxiety I have. We presently have state-sponsored segregation. That's what we got. We have school districts that could deal with this subject but can't. And, friends, they are not going to deal with it until we tell them to. I repeat, they are not going to do that. This is where the best discoveries will be found. We can respond to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR KRUSE: ...their wisdom when they meet. We've got two years of time to respond and tinker and twist and try to figure it out. But first we've got to get the discussion started. We must start the process. I urge you to give us a chance to start the process. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kruse. Senator Combs,
