- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to government; to amend section 71-612,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 60-4,115, Revised
- 3 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to eliminate the fee for
- 4 certain state identification cards and certified copies of birth
- 5 certificates; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original
- 6 sections; and to declare an emergency.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-4,115, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022, is amended to read:

3 60-4,115 (1) Fees for operators' licenses and state identification cards shall be collected by department personnel or the county treasurer 4 and distributed according to the table in subsection (2) of this section, 5 except for the ignition interlock permit and associated fees as outlined 6 in subsection (4) of this section and the 24/7 sobriety program permit 7 8 and associated fees as outlined in subsection (5) of this section. County 9 officials shall remit the county portion of the fees collected to the county treasurer for placement in the county general fund. All other fees 10 collected shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the 11 appropriate fund. 12

(2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (7) of this section, 13 the The fees provided in this subsection in the following dollar amounts 14 apply for operators' licenses and state identification cards. 15

- 10 (c) The fee for adding, changing, or removing a class, endorsement,

- 14 (5)(a) The fee for a 24/7 sobriety program permit shall be forty-
- 15 five dollars. Twenty-five dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the
- 16 State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.
- 17 Fifteen dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
- 18 credit to the General Fund. Five dollars of the fee shall be remitted to
- 19 the county treasurer for credit to the county general fund.
- 20 (b) The fee for a replacement 24/7 sobriety program permit shall be
- 21 eleven dollars. Two dollars and seventy-five cents of the fee shall be
- 22 remitted to the county treasurer for credit to the county general fund.
- 23 Six dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
- 24 credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. Two dollars and
- 25 twenty-five cents of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
- 26 credit to the General Fund.
- 27 (c) The fee for adding, changing, or removing a class, endorsement,
- 28 or restriction on a 24/7 sobriety program permit shall be five dollars.
- 29 The fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the

Sec. 2. Section 71-612, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

71-612 (1) The department, as the State Registrar, shall preserve 19 permanently and index all certificates received. The department shall 20 supply to any applicant for any proper purpose, as defined by rules and 21 regulations of the department, a certified copy of the record of any 22 23 birth, death, marriage, annulment, or dissolution of marriage or an 24 abstract of marriage. The department shall supply a copy of a public vital record for viewing purposes at its office upon an application 25 signed by the applicant and upon proof of the identity of the applicant. 26 The application may include the name, address, and telephone number of 27 28 the applicant, purpose for viewing each record, and other information as may be prescribed by the department by rules and regulations to protect 29 the integrity of vital records and prevent their fraudulent use. Except 30 as provided in subsections (2), (3), (5), (6), and (7), and (9) of this 31

section, the department shall be entitled to charge and collect in advance a fee of sixteen dollars to be paid by the applicant for each certified copy or abstract of marriage supplied to the applicant or for any search made at the applicant's request for access to or a certified

- 5 copy of any record or abstract of marriage, whether or not the record or
- 6 abstract is found on file with the department.
- (2) The department shall, free of charge, search for and furnish a 7 certified copy of any record or abstract of marriage on file with the 8 9 department upon the request of (a) the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or any lawful service organization empowered 10 represent veterans if the copy of the record or abstract of marriage is 11 to be issued, for the welfare of any member or veteran of the armed 12 forces of the United States or in the interests of any member of his or 13 14 her family, in connection with a claim growing out of service in the armed forces of the nation or (b) the Military Department. 15
  - (3) The department may, free of charge, search for and furnish a certified copy of any record or abstract of marriage on file with the department when in the opinion of the department it would be a hardship for the claimant of old age, survivors, or disability benefits under the federal Social Security Act to pay the fee provided in this section.
- (4) A strict account shall be kept of all funds received by the 21 department. Funds received pursuant to subsections (1), (5), (6), and (8) 22 of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to 23 24 the Health and Human Services Cash Fund. Money credited to the fund pursuant to this section shall be used for the purpose of administering 25 the laws relating to vital statistics and may be used to create a petty 26 cash fund administered by the department to facilitate the payment of 27 refunds to individuals who apply for copies or abstracts of records. The 28 petty cash fund shall be subject to section 81-104.01, except that the 29 amount in the petty cash fund shall not be less than twenty-five dollars 30 31 nor more than one thousand dollars.

- 1 (5) The department shall, upon request, conduct a search of death 2 certificates for stated individuals for the Nebraska Medical Association 3 or any of its allied medical societies or any inhospital staff committee pursuant to sections 71-3401 to 71-3403. If such death certificate is 4 found, the department shall provide a noncertified copy. The department 5 shall charge a fee for each search or copy sufficient to cover its actual 6 7 direct costs, except that the fee shall not exceed three dollars per individual search or copy requested. 8
- 9 (6) The department may permit use of data from vital records for statistical or research purposes under section 71-602 or disclose data 10 from certificates or records to federal, state, county, or municipal 11 agencies of government for use in administration of their official duties 12 13 and charge and collect a fee that will recover the department's cost of production of the data. The department may provide access to public vital 14 records for viewing purposes by electronic means, if available, under 15 16 security provisions which shall assure the integrity and security of the records and database and shall charge and collect a fee that shall 17 recover the department's costs. 18
- (7) In addition to the fees charged under subsection (1) of this 19 section, the department shall charge and collect an additional fee of one 20 dollar for any certified copy of the record of any birth or for any 21 search made at the applicant's request for access to or a certified copy 22 of any such record, whether or not the record is found on file with the 23 24 department. Any county containing a city of the metropolitan class which has an established city-county or county health department pursuant to 25 sections 71-1626 to 71-1636 which has an established system 26 registering births and deaths shall charge and collect in advance a fee 27 of one dollar for any certified copy of the record of any birth or for 28 any search made at the applicant's request for such record, whether or 29 not the record is found on file with the county. All fees collected under 30 this subsection shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to 31

- 1 the Nebraska Child Abuse Prevention Fund.
- 2 (8) The department shall not charge other state agencies the fees
- 3 authorized under subsections (1) and (7) of this section for automated
- 4 review of any certificates or abstracts of marriage. The department shall
- 5 charge and collect a fee from other state agencies for such automated
- 6 review that will recover the department's cost.
- 7 (9) The department shall not charge any fee for a certified copy of
- 8 <u>a birth record if the applicant does not have a current Nebraska driver's</u>
- 9 license or state identification card and the applicant indicates that the
- 10 applicant needs a state identification card for voting purposes.
- 11 Sec. 3. Original section 71-612, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 12 Nebraska, and section 60-4,115, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 13 2022, are repealed.
- 14 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 15 passed and approved according to law.
