- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to judges' salaries; to amend section
- 2 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to change
- 3 judges' salaries; to provide an operative date; to repeal the
- 4 original section; and to declare an emergency.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
2 Supplement, 2022, is amended to read:

3 24-201.01 ~~On July 1, 2020, the salary of the Chief Justice and the~~
4 ~~judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred eighty-seven thousand~~
5 ~~thirty-six dollars and one cent. On July 1, 2021, the salary of the Chief~~
6 ~~Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred ninety-~~
7 ~~two thousand six hundred forty-seven dollars and nine cents. On July 1,~~
8 2022, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court
9 shall be one hundred ninety-eight thousand four hundred twenty-six
10 dollars and fifty-one cents. On July 1, 2023, the salary of the Chief
11 Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be two hundred fourteen
12 thousand three hundred dollars and sixty-three cents. On July 1, 2024,
13 the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall
14 be two hundred thirty-one thousand four hundred forty-four dollars and
15 sixty-eight cents.

16 The Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall hold no
17 other public office of profit or trust during their terms of office nor
18 accept any public appointment or employment under the authority of the
19 government of the United States for which they receive compensation for
20 their services. Such salaries shall be payable in equal monthly
21 installments.

22 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2023.

23 Sec. 3. Original section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
24 Supplement, 2022, is repealed.

25 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
26 passed and approved according to law.
