LB 1005 establishes the Substance Abuse Treatment Grant Program to fund alcohol and controlled substances abuse treatment under the Native American Public Health Act. The grant program is to be administered by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Health clinics of federally recognized Native American tribes, Indian health organizations or other public organizations having a substantial Native American clientele may apply for grants. Priority is given to areas with the greatest incidence of alcohol and controlled substance abuse. A minimum local match is required.

The bill provides intent language for the Legislature to appropriate \$250,000 for the grant program in 2010-11. The bill does not define the minimum match required to receive a grant. HHS will have a minimal increase in workload to administer the grant program. It is assumed the workload increase can be handled with existing staff and resources. Continuation funding for the grant program is assumed after 2010-11.
