This bill states legislative intent regarding expectations when foster children are placed in a foster home by the Department of Health and Human Services or an agency contracting with the department. The expectations are: 1) foster parents are treated with dignity and respect; 2) the department regularly seeks and considers input from foster parents; 3) foster parents are provided with the necessary and appropriate training; 4) the department will encourage and facilitate communication between foster parents and other care providers; 5) the department will facilitate communication between foster parents and the child's birth family, if appropriate; 6) the department will provide timely case plan information to foster parents; 7) the department will consider former foster parents as a preferential foster care option when appropriate; 8) the department will provide timely and appropriate information to foster parents on the child; 9) foster parents will be permitted to accept or refuse placements; and 10) respite care will be encouraged and facilitated. The department is required to provide a copy of policies and procedures and rules and regulations to each foster care licensee. The legislative intent in this bill shall not be construed to create a private right of action.

Foster parents currently receive a handbook, but not all rules, regulations, policies and procedures are included. Providing the 4,649 current foster parents with all the required information would costs \$87,866 in FY 2009 and for new foster home licenses in FY 2010, the cost would be \$4,158.
