LB 573 would allow a storm spotter to display a rotating or flashing amber light on their vehicle under the conditions outlined in the bill. The Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) is required to develop training, identification, and credentialing standards for storm spotters.

NEMA has indicated that the provisions of LB 573 will not have a fiscal impact at the state level because they have already undertaken a program to develop, establish and integrate these standards into the state/local program for emergency management.

At the local level, there may be additional costs if local emergency management agencies decide to equip the vehicles of storm spotters with flashing lights. The display of these lights is not mandated so their provision and resulting cost will be up to the local agency. NEMA has indicated that these equipment costs may qualify for federal funding and in their fiscal note show federal aid expenditures of \$82,000 passing through their agency to the local level. There is a matching requirement on these federal funds that would be the responsibility of the local emergency management agency should they chose to access them.

A fiscal note response from Lancaster County shows that LB 573 will not have a fiscal impact to them since they presently follow guidelines established by the National Weather Service for storm spotters.

Explanation of Estimate:

Alert and warning of citizens is the responsibility of local government. Estimated costs for warning lights would be handled at the local level. Dependant of grant guidelines and available funding, 50% of those costs for emergency warning devices could be an eligible expense under the Federal EMPG program administered by NEMA. A local emergency management agency wanting to provide warning lights would be responsible for meeting the required match requirements for the grant.

NEMA currently has a state/local training and exercising program encompassing the aspects of the Federal National Incident Management System (NIMS). The NIMS program covers integrating training, identification and credentialing standards for emergency management workers into state and local programs. NEMA has undertaken a state level program to develop, establish and integrate these standards into the state/local program for emergency management. At the state level, there would be no additional costs, either state or Federal funds, as NEMA is currently operating under the established agency budget to build out this program. Any additional costs to be borne at the local level for equipment purchases for identification systems would be an eligible expense under current and future emergency management and homeland security grant funds. Projected costs would cover the purchase of needed equipment through Department of Homeland Security grant funds to support local needs for identification.

There would be no Personal Services needed for the program; handled by current agency staff and support from the National Weather Service who provides the weather spotter training across the state.
