LB 421 increases the upper limit of the fee that may be charged for the annual, daily and duplicate park entry permit. The upper limit for the issuance fee is also increased.

The following table shows the current fee, the proposed fee, and the anticipated increase in revenue to the Park Cash Fund. These estimates were taken from the fiscal note that was prepared by the Game and Parks Commission and appear reasonable. Any assumptions are listed below the table.

Explanation of Estimate: The proposed legislation would provide for an increase in the fees for park entry permits along with the issuance fee that can be collected for each. The current fee structure for park entry permits is \$20 - Annual; \$10 – Duplicate Annual; and \$4 – Daily. The new fees could be \$25 – Annual; \$12.50 – Duplicate Annual and \$5 - Daily for an increase in each of \$5, \$2.50 and \$1 respectively. While legislation provides for a differentiation in Resident and Nonresident permits, none has been adopted, thus all are sold at the resident rate structure. The current issuance fee is \$0.35 for each permit. The new fee could be \$1.00, which would match the fee collected for hunting/fishing license issuance. The Commission currently collects \$1.00 for internet issued park entry permits to cover mailing costs, but has opted not to collect the current \$0.35 fee for on-site issuance for change making convenience. The Commission would likely collect a \$1.00 fee for on-site issued Annual and Duplicate Annual permits, but not on Daily permits if the legislation were adopted. While it would be anticipated that there could be a decline in sales due to an increase in fees (historically this has been as much as 5%), it has not been consistent for each increase nor permit type and it is indistinguishable from normal year to year fluctuations. permits issued during the last fee increase. For the purposes of this note only a slight decrease from current 2010 projected sales will be used to estimate additional revenues generated by a fee increase.

Fee increases would be applicable to 2012 permits. The following chart summarizes the estimated revenue calculations based on a 'fiscal year' sales pattern for the calendar year permits. It should be noted the issuance fee projections only represent the portion likely to be collected by the Commission (not external agents), namely Annual and Duplicate Annual issued on-site (not internet issued). Approximately 50% of the Annual and Duplicate Annual permits sold are sold on-site at Commission facilities (86% of Daily's).

FY11/12 revenue collections would only be a partial year of 2012 permit sales and is estimated to be \$779,175, while FY12/13 would be a full years collection of permit sales (albeit 2 calendar year permits 2012 and 2013) estimated at \$1,176,500. Both these amounts include the increase issuance fee. All fees would be deposited to the Park Cash Fund.

## APPLICABLE NOTES AND ASSUMPTIONS

Approximately 75% of Annual Park Entry Permits sales occur Jan-June, and 32% of Daily Park Entry Permits.

The issue fee for Park Entry Permits is currently \$0.35, the fee will likely be raised to \$1.00 on Annual/Dup (not daily)

\*\*the Commission currently does not collect the 0.35 fee but would likely collect the fee if \$1.
