LB 1052 would require county boards to give private landowners 30 days notice, by certified mail, of their intent to enter said private property for the purposes listed in the bill (in general, the protection of county roads).

It would appear that the only related cost to the counties would be for certified mail charges. This cost is expected to be minimal.

The Nebraska Association of County Officials has indicated that LB 1052 is expected to have little or no fiscal impact on counties.
