LB 13 changes provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act.

Section 2 adds definitions for the words: "Board", "Governing body", and "Representative".

Section 5 requires the governing body of each public agency participating in the creation of a joint entity to adopt a resolution determining that there is a need for a joint entity and setting forth the names of the proposed participating public agencies. Publication of such resolutions is also required.

Section 6 requires the joint entity to file with the Secretary of State a statement signed by the proposed representatives setting forth the names of all the proposed participating public agencies, a certified copy of each of the resolutions required under section 5, proof of publication as required under section 5, a brief description of the nature of the joint entity's activities, and the name of the joint entity. This filing shall occur within thirty days of the adoption of the resolution for creation.

Sections 9 through 13 address expansion of joint entities and membership requirements for representation on boards and board organization.

The provisions of LB 13 do not pose explicit additional costs to the state nor to political subdivision. To the degree that such public agencies choose to create joint entities, there may be costs incurred as well as savings due to economies of scale. Since such joint entities are elective in nature, their costs are not attributable to the provisions of LB 13.
