**Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.**

LB 939 establishes the offense of false presentation if a person furnishes proof of financial responsibility that is false to a peace officer or other official with the intent to impede a criminal investigation or to acquire a motor vehicle registration. A person convicted of a violation is guilty of a Class I misdemeanor. The bill requires the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to suspend all registrations of persons convicted of false presentation unless the person gives and maintains proof of responsibility for three years.

DMV indicates that the current driver license database is not linked to the database with information on vehicle registrations. The bill will require computer programming to modify the Vehicle Title Registration System, the mainframe driver record database and the database maintained by the Crime Commission. It will also require computer programming to allow DMV to link to the database used by law enforcement to identify vehicles with suspended registrations. DMV estimates one-time costs for computer programming of \$202,173 of cash funds. The department indicates it may take up to eighteen months for existing programming staff to complete the computer programming necessary to link the different databases.

It is assumed there will not be a considerable number of people found guilty of false presentation pursuant to the bill. The maximum penalty for a Class I misdemeanor is not greater than one year imprisonment, or a \$1,000 fine, or both. There is no minimum penalty. It is assumed there will be minimal revenue received from fines or penalties. Any revenue from fines accrues to the county where the violation occurs for use by the public schools.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 939 creates the offense of false presentation of proof of insurance and provides upon conviction the suspension of all vehicle registrations in the name of such person. The suspension portion of the bill creates a new process that links the driver license database to the vehicle records and the court system.

The new process will require extensive modifications to the Vehicle Titling and Registration System (VTR), the mainframe driver record database, NLETS, and NCJIS computer systems.
