LB 103 requires school boards to establish policies and procedures to allow students from schools which elect not to meet approval and accreditation requirements (exempt home schools) to participate in extracurricular activities and events. The policies may require such students to enroll in no more than one course offered for credit by the school district. Such students will not be eligible for transportation, except to or from practices or events, to the same extent as public school students.

The bill will increase the workload of school boards to develop policies and procedures pursuant to the bill which may result in a onetime minimal increase in expenditures. The provision of the bill which allows a school district to require students from exempt home schools to take one course in order to participate in extracurricular activities may impact the number of students in course offerings. However, since the language is permissive, it is assumed the bill will have a minimal, if any, fiscal impact for schools to include such students in courses offered by a district. Explanation of Estimate:

SUMMARY: In 2006, LB 821 passed, (codified at 79-8,136). That law requires each school district to have a policy that allows "part-time enrollment" of resident students that are either enrolled in an approved or accredited non-public school or in an exempt ("home") school. This bill adds to that by also providing that each district must establish policies that allow the participation *of the exempt (home) school students* in any extracurricular activity/event as that term is defined in the Student Fee Act. It also states that a district may require that to participate in those activities or events, the district *may* require a student to "enroll in *no more than one* course. Also, the district must provide transportation to and from such events/activities to these students on the same basis as it does for its traditional public school students.

FISCAL IMPACT: None on NDE. Districts could incur additional expenses.
