Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 511 requires each approved or accredited public, private, denominational or parochial school to establish a return to learn protocol for students returning to school after being treated for pediatric cancer. The bill will increase the workload of schools to develop a protocol. It may increase expenditures of schools depending upon informal or formal accommodations, modifications of curriculum and monitoring by medical or academic staff contained in the protocol and the number of students impacted by the protocol.

The bill has no fiscal impact for the state. However, the State Department of Education (NDE) indicates the department could convene a group to study the issue and develop a model policy to be used by approved and accredited schools. NDE estimates a one-time general fund impact of \$4,440 for two meetings of a ten-member group.
