Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB436 establishes a 3-year pilot program at the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) to expand pediatric dental residents from 8 to 10 residents; add a pediatric dental faculty position and stipends to dental residents to provide services at federally qualified health centers. LB436 also requires UNMC to provide care coordination such as translation and transportation services. The state-supported pediatric dental residents would be based at the UNMC Pediatric Dental Clinic at Children's Hospital in Omaha.

UNMC estimates the costs to be \$115,416 for FY2015-16 and \$308,844 for FY2016-17. There is no basis to disagree with the estimate.

**Explanation of Estimate** 

LB 436 will appropriate funds from the General Fund to UNMC to support the establishment a three year pilot program to expand pediatric dental residents from the current enrollment of eight residents to ten residents and to analyze the benefits and costs of increasing state-supported pediatric dentistry residency positions at UNMC. Increasing the number of dental residents will help alleviate the lack of access to pediatric dental care for underserved urban children in metropolitan cities, thereby improving overall health outcomes. The first year of the program will require recruitment and hiring of a faculty member and a coordinator to develop the program during the 4 months immediately preceding the arrival of residents. Part of program development includes securing CODA approval of expansion of the residency program and recruitment of qualified residents. The second year of the program will see the fulltime faculty member and the fulltime coordinator/dental hygienist funded from state appropriations. The equivalent of 0.40 FTE of a resident will also be funded from state appropriations.
