LB 664 changes provisions related to the Nebraska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission.

Section 1 provides a definition for "Wastewater".

Section 2 requires the commission to require any person applying for permission to dispose of wastewater, including wastewater produced in other states, to provide a listing of all chemicals in the wastewater. For applications that are granted, the commission shall require semiannual updates to the listing, which shall be public records.

The Nebraska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission estimates no fiscal costs associated with the bill's provisions.

## **Explanation of Estimate:**

TOTAL FUNDS

The proposed addition to Nebraska Revised Statute 57-905 would not require any alterations to the existing rules and regulations of the Commission and its requirements could be implemented at no cost. Regulations for the disposal of oilfield wastes under NRS 57-905(4)(e), including salt water, are in-place currently.

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At the present time, each application for a salt water disposal well must include an analysis of a sample of the fluids to be injected and is currently required under Title 267, Chapter 4 – 004.02J2 and 02J3. The requirement for semiannual analyses of injectates would be accomplished in the discrete Commission order for each commercial disposal well. All chemical analyses of produced waters are currently available to the public since the Commission's files are in the public domain.
