Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 552 requires a Children's Connection program to be created in each of the six behavioral health regions of the state. The Division of Behavioral Health in the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is required to administer the Children's Connection Program. Each program is a partnership between the behavioral health regions and public and private schools in the state.

<u>HHS Operating Expenditures</u>: The bill requires HHS to solicit annual plans from the behavioral health regions, identify evidence-based best practices, provide evidence-based training for mental health providers on at least a biannual basis, and complete an annual evaluation of the program in each region. HHS indicates the need for a Program Specialist to administer the aid program, provide training and prepare an annual evaluation. The cost of the additional staff member and related operating expenses is \$58,778 of general funds in FY2017-18 and \$78,370 of general funds in FY2018-19.

State Aid for Children's Connection Programs: LB 552 provides intent language to appropriate \$2 million each fiscal year to HHS for allocation to behavioral health regions to develop and provide Children's Connection programs. The bill specifies activities to be carried out with the funding. A local match of at least 25% is required in order to receive state funding.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 552 specifies the Legislature's intent to appropriate \$2,000,000 in each fiscal year to the Department of Health and Human Services for distribution to the behavioral health regions to establish a Children's Connection program. This fiscal note assumes General Fund financing, as an alternative source of funding is not identified in the bill.

The Department would require 1.00 FTE DHHS Program Specialist in order to administer contracts, RFPs, standards and regulations development, and technical assistance and training pursuant to the Children's Connection program.
