There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Health and Human Services. While there is potential for the loss of savings expected from the delivery of medical services via managed care, these are not quantifiable in the context of LB 649. However, this bill will limit Medicaid's ability to manage costs as effectively as in managed care, creating further budget unpredictability. There will be costs and administrative expenses associated with maintaining a fee-for-service system, including claims processing. This will lead to an increase in the number of claims processed by the claims broker services (CBS) system.
