LB 164 amends statutes to redefine who is eligible for relocation assistance when persons are displaced due to a publicly financed project.

Fiscal note responses from the cities of Omaha and Lincoln indicate no significant financial impact, and no fiscal impact, respectively. The fiscal note from the Department of Roads indicates that the added restrictions on who qualifies for assistance may limit their relocation expenses in certain instances. In general, it would appear that the changes proposed by LB 164 will not have a fiscal impact, but may in certain cases allow for a reduction in expenses of affected state agencies and political subdivisions.
