LB 836 makes it unlawful for a person to smoke in a car when a person under age 16 is also in the vehicle. Violators are fined \$50 - \$150, unless a smoking cessation program is entered into for a first offense. Violations are considered to be a primary offense.

The bill may increase fine revenue received by counties by an unknown amount. All fines accrue to the public schools in the subdivision where the violation occurs. Any fiscal impact is projected to be minimal.
