LB889 would rename the Nebraska Schools Construction Alternatives Act as the Political Subdivisions Construction Alternatives Act. Under provisions of the bill, the act would continue to be applicable to school districts and would extend applicability of the act to other political subdivisions as defined in the bill to specifically include cities, villages, counties, community colleges and state colleges. The bill would grant authority to such entities to enter into design-build contracts and construction management at risk contracts according to procedures under the act. This authorization would generally be restricted to exclude road, street, highway, water, wastewater, utility, or sewer construction (with a specific exception). Relevant entities would not be compelled to utilize the alternative methods of contracting for capital projects, but rather would be permitted to do so. Fiscal note responses from a sampling of affected entities reflect anecdotal estimates of potential savings that may be realized under the alternative contracting methods. However, the impact of LB889 is indeterminate.
