LB 252 allows the Nebraska Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors to direct applicants for examination to pay examination fees to a third party.

Under current law, applicants pay a non-refundable fee to the Board. This fee currently works as an application fee, a testing fee, and a first year licensing fee.

Not all of the applicants that currently pay the all encompassing, non-refundable fee are approved to take the exam. However, for those that are approved, the Board must pay testing fees to the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) and the Engineering and Land Surveying Examination Service (ELSES), which currently exceed the non-refundable fees allowed under statute. This creates a situation where the fees from applicants that are not approved are subsidizing the costs of those that are approved to take the exam.

Under the provisions of LB 252, the Board would be able to establish a non-refundable application fee, direct those that are approved for examination to pay NCEES/ELSES for their exam, and then collect a licensing fee from those individuals who pass the examination. LB 252 would eliminate all examination expenses paid by the Board.
