LB 908 changes provisions relating to the number of sets of former prisoner of war or disabled American veteran license plates that may be issued to an individual. Currently, individuals may apply for these plates for only one motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer or cabin trailers. The bill allows the plates to be on any number of motor vehicles or trailers owned by an applicant.

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) indicates 94 sets of former prisoner of war and 418 sets of disabled American veteran plates were issued in 2006. Applicants for plates pay the regular license plate fee and an additional $\$ 5$ fee for the specialty plates. The $\$ 5$ fee is placed in the Highway Trust Fund. Increased revenue for the Highway Trust Fund is projected to be up to $\$ 2,500$ pursuant to the bill, assuming each of the current plate holders apply for an additional plate. It is assumed DMV can handle any increased need for plates with existing appropriations for license plate production.
