Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB1169 creates the Nebraska Integrated Juvenile Data Governing Body to develop a plan to create and sustain a unified juvenile justice & child welfare data system. The Juvenile Data Governing Body is to establish three support governing bodies to assist with its work and provide recommendations for a plan to develop a statewide education, juvenile justice, and child welfare unified data system (Nebraska Juvenile Justice Information System) to include fully integrated data from:

- --State Department of Education
- -- Department of Health and Human Services
- --case management system used by Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program
- -- juvenile probation system
- -- juvenile detention centers
- --case management system used by state trial courts
- --state and local law enforcement agencies
- --Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice
- --county attorney offices

Additionally, LB1169 authorizes the Juvenile Data Governing Body to establish separate management and technical assistance teams to support development and drafting of the plan referenced above. The bill provides that the Juvenile Data Governing Body is to provide progress reports to the Legislature's Health and Human Services and Judiciary Committees on or before January 1, 2022 and July 1, 2022. The governing body is to complete the plan as provided by the bill and submit a report to the Governor and Legislature by July 1, 2023.

LB1169 further provides that the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Juvenile Justice Institute is to manage the Nebraska Juvenile Justice Information System, maintain current publicly available data to information system users, and provide training and technical assistance statewide on data collection.

Fiscal note responses from the Legislative Council, Supreme Court, Department of Correctional Services, Foster Care Review Office and Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice identify no definitive fiscal impacts with respect to provisions of LB1169.

Fiscal note responses from the Department of Education and the University of Nebraska reflect estimated fiscal impacts associated with provisions of LB1169 as follows:

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 1169 would create a governing body to develop and maintain a central, integrated juvenile justice and child welfare data system, which would include Department of Education, Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), juvenile probation, law enforcement, trial court, and juvenile detention center data. The governing body would include the governor and leadership from a variety of state agencies and outside organizations, including the Department of Education, DHHS, the Inspector General of Nebraska Child Welfare, Foster Care Review Office, DHHS Children and Family Services, DHHS Public Health, and the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement. This governing body would establish other committees for prevention and early intervention, juvenile justice systems and facilities, and data sharing.

This fiscal note assumes that the integrated data system would be able to accept the data provided by the Department without any modification. Also, several members of the DHHS administration would serve on the Governing Body. That work would be done within the Department's current appropriation. As a result, LB 1169 would have no fiscal impact to the Department of Health and Human Services.

Supporting the work through additional resources would expedite the completion of additional use cases and address the type of expectations targeted within the LB in addition to support the sustainability of efforts implemented. There have been several efforts over the years to require a "data dump" of information into a single research database, but the reality is that is not a viable option to ensure the security and viability of the data. The efforts need to be first driven by the questions desired to be answered or the specific interventions to improve process and outcomes. This enables solutions to the specific legal and technical questions.

Estimating the amount of time in meetings, reviewing documentation, and planning is difficult to estimate as outlined in the bill. Using previous experiences that focused on creating data system project plans resulting in publications or efforts to secure for grant funding.

Estimate approach: Assume there would be weekly meetings to address the different efforts, legal review of approaches, technical details and analysis, and general updates and review provides approximately 12.5 hours a week x 50 weeks = 625 hours/ year x 3 people = 1,875 hours/year x 2.5 years (for the plans and reports) = 4,687.5 hours x \$54.50 (average Salary/Benefits) = \$255,468.75 in staff time. The estimated staff time during the 20-21 and 21-22 years would be estimated at \$102,187 each year.
