This bill would increase the indigent defense court filing fee. The current fee is \$3, and this bill would increase it as follows:

\$5: Beginning on the effective date of this act and until June 30, 2022;

\$6: July 1, 2022, and until June 30, 2023;

\$7: July 1, 2023, and until June 30, 2024;

\$8: July 1, 2024, and until June 30, 2025; and

\$9: Beginning on July 1, 2025.

In FY20, the \$3 fee brought in approximately \$839 thousand dollars.

**Explanation of Estimate:** 

Since 2005, the Nebraska Commission on Public Advocacy has been funded by a \$3 indigent defense fee that is taxed as court costs in cases filed in Nebraska's courts. The Commission receives no general funds. Since fiscal year 2008-09, the number of cases filed in Nebraska's courts has decreased every year, and so has the Commission's revenue. The Commission's revenue from the indigent defense fee was \$1,286,956 in fy2008-2009. In fy2019-2020, the Commission's revenue from the fee was only \$839,313. Thus far in fy2020-21, the Commission's revenue from the fee is only \$386,756.22. Since fiscal year 2014-15, revenue has not been sufficient to cover expenses and the Commission had to draw from its cash fund. Without additional revenue, the cash fund balance could be depleted in less than two years.

The Commission provides legal services for indigent criminal defendants charged with murder and other serious violent felony offenses at no charge to the counties that use the Commission's services. The Commission is operating at maximum caseload and is forced to decline court appointments in most cases that do not include a murder charge.

Based upon the revenue the Commission has received from the indigent defense fee since fy2008-09, the Commission estimates a \$2 increase in the indigent defense fee should produce approximately \$520,000 in additional revenue in fy2021-22. A \$3 increase should produce approximately \$780,000 in additional revenue in fy2022-23.

The increased revenue will be used to cover expenses and hire an additional lawyer. With an additional lawyer, the Commission will be able to accept more court appointments and provide additional property tax relief to counties that are required to provide legal services to indigent criminal defendants.
