LB538 creates the Community Schools Act and amends §79-1035.

The Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) will administer the Community Schools Act and employ two people to oversee, monitor, and assist in operations under the act.

The commissioner of education will establish a competitive application process and timeline in which a community school consortium may submit an application for pilot program funding on behalf of an eligible school. Beginning with school year 2022-23, the board, upon recommendation of the commissioner, will award pilot program funding to two eligible schools in each congressional district to plan, implement, and improve community school programming.

An eligible school may receive up to one hundred fifty thousand dollars in pilot project funding for each of five consecutive school fiscal years.

Each community school receiving pilot project will hire or contract with a partner agency to hire a site coordinator, who will be a member of the community school leadership team, to coordinate community school programming at such community school.

In awarding funding, the commissioner will prioritize, in addition to factors related to the community school plan and other requirements of the Community Schools Act, eligible schools with significant populations of students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunches, eligible schools with a significant proportion of homeless students, highly mobile students, or students with disabilities and equity among eligible urban, suburban, and rural schools.

On or before July 1 following the completion of the pilot project, each community school will submit a report to the board and electronically to the Education Committee of the Legislature and will make such report available at the community school and on the community school and school district web sites. The report will describe efforts to integrate community school programming and the effect of the transition to a community school on participating children and adults.

NDE estimates a cost of \$207,140 for the two required FTE's with an additional \$30,000 for operating expenses. There are six congressional districts in Nebraska so twelve school districts will be eligible to receive \$150,000 annually, the five year cost of funding for those districts will be equal to \$1,800,000.

Based on information provided by the Board of Educational Lands and Funds, the amount of revenue generated from the income of solar and wind agreements would not support the amount identified by the agency. Additionally, the funding identified in the bill would reduce the amount of apportionments that the school districts receives. Apportionment is included as a receipt in the TEEOSA formula.
