Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill would change provisions relating to presumptions regarding causes of death or disability of firefighters and firefighter-paramedics.

The Workers' Compensation Court estimates no fiscal impact from this bill.

The City of Imperial estimates additional expenditures of \$2,000 for increased workers' compensation and disability rates.

The City of Lincoln estimates no fiscal impact from this bill.

The City of Omaha estimates an impact of more than \$100,000 per year, stating this bill would require them to pay more workers' compensation benefits than they do under current law.

Because this bill broadens cases covered under the Workers' Compensation Act, it is not unreasonable that additional costs could be incurred. At this time, there is no basis to disagree, except to note that Omaha's estimate appears high, especially since Lincoln is showing no impact.
