LB 465 would authorize payment from the Behavioral Health Services Fund for landlord risk mitigation payments. The payments would be utilized to pay for damages, lost rent, legal fees or any other expenses incurred by a landlord, in excess of the security deposit, that result from renting a property unit to a low-income adult with serious mental illness.

The passage of this bill has no direct fiscal impact as no additional appropriations are requested; however, it would reduce the funding available to use for housing vouchers. Additionally, the bill does not establish limits for reimbursement nor does it require landlords to use existing remedies, such as renter's insurance or liability coverage, prior to requesting reimbursement.

The LB 465 is related to authorizing the use of the Behavioral Health Services Cash Fund for landlord risk mitigation. The bill would allow for existing housing related assistance funding through this fund to be used to reimburse landlords for damages above any deposits made for the rental. While including this provision will not require additional funds to be awarded, it is important to note that it will decrease the availability of funds to be used for vouchers. The bill does not establish any maximum amount to be reimbursed nor does it require landlords to use existing remedies (e.g., renters insurance or liability coverage) prior to requesting any reimbursement.
