Explanation of Estimate:

LB969 is appropriating \$10,000,000 from federal ARPA Funds for FY2022-23 to the Department of Environment and Energy to award grants for electric infrastructure projects.

Section 1(3)(b))(i) requires the department to establish a grant program within 90 days of the effective day of the act. It would take four temporary .25 FTEs and one full-time FTE to establish a program, and one permanent FTE to maintain the program thereafter. NDEE has prepared this fiscal note assuming the department's administrative costs will be allocated from the \$10 million federal ARPA Funds. If that is not accurate, NDEE recommends clarifying language be added to the bill to specify how NDEE costs will be covered.
