Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB1074 establishes the Surface Water Irrigation Fund within the Department of Natural Resources, creates a one-time transfer from the Cash Reserve Fund, and defines eligibility under the grants. As a result of the transfer, there will be a reduction of the Cash Reserve Fund's revenue of \$50,000,000 and a revenue gain of \$50,000,000 in the Surface Water Irrigation Fund.

Department of Natural Resources estimates one full-time grant administrator will be required to administer this program. We have no basis to disagree with the agency. The agency anticipates approximately \$29.75 million in aid will be distributed in the first year of the program and approximately \$20 million in aid in the second year of the program. We have no basis to disagree with the agency.

Explanation of Estimate:

The bill creates the Surface Water Irrigation Infrastructure Fund and provides for a \$50M transfer from the Cash Reserve Fund. The Department is given the duty to establish procedures and criteria for awarding and administering grants to irrigation districts from the Fund. The bill is silent on funding sources of necessary administrative costs so the agency assumes appropriated Cash Reserve Fund resources may be used for its administrative costs. The negative \$50 million in "Other Funds" in FY2022-23 shown above is showing the transfer from the Cash Reserve Fund.

Agency administrative costs are set out below and the balance of expenditures for infrastructure costs made in grants is set out as Aid. The agency assumes grants at will be funded in each of the two fiscal years with the need for continued contract support activities extending beyond the review period. Fund resources may be used for repair or construction of any headgate, flume, diversion structure, check valve, or any other physical structure used for irrigation projects. Grants may not exceed five million dollars per applicant; grant applicant must provide matching funds equal to ten percent of the grant amount awarded.
