Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill appropriates \$500,000 in FY 2023 from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund to each of the following agencies: the Commission on Indian Affairs, the Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired, the Commission on African-American Affairs, the Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and the Commission on Latino-Americans. Each commission is to hire a health equity liaison and work with the Department of Health and Human Services and the University of Nebraska to collect data. Each commission is required to submit a report to the Legislature no later than October 1, 2024, outlining recommendations to address health inequities for the population served by their respective commissions. The bill contains the emergency clause.

The commissions would either contract or hire the health equity liaisons. The appropriations are provided in FY 2023, but for purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed that the funding would be expended over two fiscal years. There is no fiscal impact to either the Department of Health and Human Services or the University of Nebraska.

The bill directs the use of a portion of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding available under the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF).

The following are the allowed uses of SLFRF funds:

- Replace lost public sector revenue, using this funding to provide government services up to the amount of revenue lost due
 to the pandemic
- Respond to the far-reaching public health and negative economic impacts of the pandemic, by supporting the health of
 communities, and helping households, small businesses, impacted industries, nonprofits, and the public sector recover from
 economic impacts
- Provide premium pay for essential workers, offering additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health
 risks because of their service in critical sectors
- Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure, making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking
 water, to support vital wastewater and storm water infrastructure, and to expand affordable access to broadband internet

Explanation of Estimate: It is anticipated that the commission (NCIA) would contract for the services necessary to fulfill the stated purpose of LB 1267, rather than hire temporary employees. Expenditure is based upon initial FY 2022-2023 appropriation of the funds to the commission with the understanding that as part of the agency planning and implementation there is an obligation to notify the legislature by October, 1, 2023 if it does not anticipate utilizing all of the appropriated funds by December 31, 2024.

The contracted services would include contracting with a health equity liaison, but would also include as necessary contracting with other organizations with the necessary capacity and expertise to compile, with oversight by the commission, the legislatively mandated report for submission. It is anticipated the commission oversight of the health liaison as well as of other contractors would impose a significant capacity demand upon the commission with this demand including extra staff hours as well as other additional administrative costs that may be incurred in the implementation, support, oversight and reporting of activities and expenditures related to this legislation.

Explanation of Estimate:

As specified by Section 2 of the Bill, the Commission on Latino-Americans shall employ or contract with a health equity liaison to serve as a liaison between patients, hospitals, the Department of Health and Human Services, and other stakeholders to help identify and address health disparities for the population served by the commission. The contact will be with a consulting firm that will provide the liaison services. The consulting firm will provide the salary, benefits, travel expenses, therefore reducing the accounting burden to the Commission on Latino American affairs. The Commission has only three staff members and no dedicated accounting department.

The Commission has partnerships with stakeholders in the cities of Omaha, Lincoln, South Sioux City, Norfolk, Madison, Columbus, Schuyler, Hastings, Grand Island, Lexington, North Platte, Scottsbluff, and the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Foundation. We anticipate several monthly trips by both, the liaison, and the commission staff to each of these localities in the course of two years. Travel expenses for both, liaison and Commission staff are estimated at \$59557.98.

As Section 2 of the Bill also specifies, The Commission on Latino American Affairs shall work with the department, the University of Nebraska, and other organizations to collect data and submit a report electronically to the Legislature no later than October 1, 2024, outlining recommendations to address health inequities for the population served by the commission. For purposes of this requirement, the Commission shall contract with the University of Nebraska Minority Health Initiative to draft a statistically significant survey, analyze the data in conjunction with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, write a report and submit it electronically to the Legislature no later than October 1, 2024, outlining recommendations to address health inequities for the population served by the commission. The cost of the contract for survey drafting, data analysis and report is calculated at \$115,000.00. In addition, the Commission will incur in administrative expenses estimated at \$12,000.00 yearly.
