Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 222, if passed, would not allow any public college or university in Nebraska to inquire about any criminal history or juvenile court records at any stage of the application process, unless where already required by state or federal law.

The Nebraska State College System (NSCS) explains that it would experience a fiscal impact relating to the cost of having its three admissions applications systems updated to remove the questions related to criminal background. This would have to be contracted through the University of Nebraska, with a total cost of 120 hours of contract work, estimated at \$4,893.21.

The NSCS further explains that they have no way of knowing if limiting the system's ability to ask about a student's background could increase its liability in the event a student with a criminal background harms another student, or if having such a statute gives them an affirmative defense that could be used in future potential litigation.

With respect to the University of Nebraska system, its generic admissions applications do not ask for criminal background history, with some notable exceptions. The most significant exception involves the health sciences professions at UNMC. UNMC, like other medical colleges in the United States, uses a common, nationwide application for their health professions degrees, including nursing.

Elsewhere in the University system, non-medical programs that require licensure and field placements (education, social work, law, etc) also require this information when students are admitted into College-level programs or before their acceptance into a required field placement.

The University explains that their initial fiscal impact of \$100,000 reflects an estimated cost to begin planning to replace the current application systems with a customized solution at UNMC. They further note that a new customized application system would likely cost more than \$1,000,000, and that it is not certain that such a change could be implemented promptly and without consequences to student enrollment and accreditation statuses. There could also be undetermined fiscal impact associated with notifying and educating employees about the law, reviewing and revising current policies, and educating students regarding the impact of a criminal record on placement in clinical rations, state licensure, etc.

Finally, the University explains that if bill language were modified to exclude all programs leading to state/federal/local licensure, there would be no cost associated with such a modified LB 222.

For the purpose of this fiscal note, the costs to the University and to the NSCS systems are combined. It is uncertain at this time whether the two programming issues are completely separate, or how dependent the NSCS changes are dependent upon the University's changes.

The University of Nebraska System's generic admissions applications does not ask for criminal background history, with several notable exceptions.

The most significant exception relates to the health sciences professions at UNMC. UNMC, like medical colleges across the United States, uses a common, nationwide application for their health professions degrees (including nursing). This standard application requests criminal history data because of the subsequent requirement for students to work in public and private clinical settings and their eventual licensure.

Non-medical programs that require licensure and field placements (education, social work, law, etc.) also require this information when students are admitted into College-level programs or before their acceptance into a required field placement.

The estimated fiscal impact only reflects an estimate to begin planning to replace the current application systems with a customized solution at UNMC. Please note, the cost of a new customized application system would likely be more than \$1 million. In addition, it is not certain that such a system could be implemented promptly and without consequences to student enrollment and accreditation statuses.

Additionally, there is an undetermined fiscal impact associated with: (1) Notifying and educating employees about the law and requirements; (2) Reviewing and revising current policies related to criminal history inquiries; (3) Reviewing and revising application materials; and (4) Potentially educating applicants and students regarding the impact of a criminal record on placement in clinical rotations, state licensure, etc.

If the bill language were modified to exclude all programs leading to state/federal/local licensure, there would be no cost associated with such a modified LB 222.
