Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 742 changes provisions of the Election Act.

LB 742 specifies that photographs in the possession of the Secretary of State, the election commissioner, or the county clerk shall not be public records as defined in section 84-712.01 and not subject to disclosure under sections 84-712 to 84-712.09. Electronic poll books for precincts shall contain photographs used to verify identification of voters in the precinct. Registered voters without a photograph in the electronic poll book shall show identification or photographic identification before casting a ballot.

Section 5 requires the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), with assistance of the Secretary of State (SoS), to prescribe a voter registration application that is designed so that voter information is transmitted to the election commissioner or county clerk unless the voter specifies that he or she does not want to register to voter or update the voter registration record.

Section 16 is an outright repeal of 32-309.

The provisions of LB 742 make voter registration automatic for qualified driver's license and state ID applicants, unless the applicant specifies that he or she does not wish to register to vote. The SoS estimates this will result in an additional 300,000 voter registrations each year. In order to administer the increased number of applicant transactions, the SoS identifies the need for 1.0 IT Infrastructure Support Technician. This estimate appears to be reasonable.

SoS notes that the provisions of section 60-484.02(3) do not allow for DMV or law enforcement officials to release digital images for the purposes described in LB 742. Under the current provisions of LB 742, SoS does not believe it would be able to obtain digital images. Should the bill's language be modified to allow for this, SoS estimates its fiscal costs will increase by \$17,000.

Explanation of Estimate:						

LB742 proposes automatic voter registration. There would be ongoing costs associated with the proposed legislation as it would significantly increase the amount of data being transmitted. We currently process about 250,000 transactions on average per year, and we expect that this change could result in an increase to approximately 550,000 transactions each year. As a result of this increased traffic, we estimate increased costs from the OCIO of approximately \$1,900 per year. We also anticipate needing an IT Infrastructure Support Tech to monitor the system transactions given the additional volume and to troubleshoot issues that may arise. This position is expected to cost approximately \$75,500 per year for salary, benefits, equipment, supplies, and technology expenses.

Additionally, Section 3 of LB742 appears to propose modifications to our voter registration system to pull in photographs from DMV records, in addition to the digital signature currently pulled. However, statute 60-484.02(3) prevents our office from obtaining digital images from DMV, so as currently stated, we do not believe we would be able to obtain any photographs. Should the language be modified, our system vendor estimates these modifications would cost \$17,000 Due to the uncertainty of obtaining photographs from the DMV records, we have not included this cost in the expenditures estimated above.
