LB478 amends several sections to change provisions relating to the Nebraska Juvenile Code & the education of certain juveniles.

All public schools in Nebraska, including, but not limited to, schools operated by school districts & education programs that serve juveniles detained, placed, or committed outside of such juveniles' homes by an order of the juvenile court or pursuant to the Nebraska Juvenile code, shall be accredited by the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE).

Beginning July 1, 2024, if a juvenile is detained, placed, or committed outside of the juvenile's home by an order of the juvenile court or pursuant to any provision of the Nebraska Juvenile Code for more than twenty-four hours, the court will immediately notify the superintendent of the school district.

On or before July 1, 2024, NDE will establish an educational division responsible for the education of juveniles placed, committed, or detained outside of their homes or otherwise unable to attend school as a result of an order of the juvenile court or pursuant to the Nebraska Juvenile Code.

On & after July 1, 2024, the responsibility for education programs in state institutions under the supervision of the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS) that house juveniles will transfer to NDE & their educational division.

On & after July 1, 2024, whenever DHHS is referred to or designated by any contract or other document in connection with the duties & functions transferred to NDE. All contracts entered into by DHHS prior to July 1, 2024, in connection with the duties & functions transferred to NDE are recognized, with NDE succeeding to all rights & obligations under those contracts.

On July 1, 2024, all books, documents, & records of DHHS pertaining to the duties & functions transferred to NDE will become the property of NDE & their education division.

EXPENDITURES:

DHHS estimates LB478 will eliminate an FTE with salary/benefits of \$111,838 & also eliminate operating expenses of \$79,159.

NDE estimates that the creation of the new educational division will add 9 FTEs to their staffing. For FY2023-24, the salary/benefits will be \$1,054,230, the operating expenses will be \$89,441, & the travel expenses will be \$48,406. For FY2024-25, the salary/benefits will be \$1,106,942, the operating expenses will be \$69,728, & the travel expenses will be \$49,858. NDE also estimates the need for \$150,000 annually for materials, supplies, professional learning, & contracted services.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB478 would transfer educational responsibilities of incarcerated youth from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services to the Nebraska Department of Education. The NDE does not know of the current funding provided by the Legislature and used by DHHS for education which the bill transfers to NDE.

The bill would require the NDE to create a new division, which would require the following positions:

- Superintendent of Schools (Senior Administrator)
- Directors of Special Education & Teaching and Learning (Administrators)
- Director of Systems Involved Youth (Program Specialist IV)
- Administrative Assistant (Office Associate I Executive)
- Education Specialists (Program Specialist III)
 - Detention Facility Specialist (2)
 - YRTC Specialist (2)

These specialists would oversee the transfer in and out of these students and ensure proper records are received prior to transferring in. The YRTC Specialist would participate in 60-day Re-Entry court hearings and prepare and/or sign off on the education court reports. Each specialist would work closely with Probation and DHHS to provide potential discharge dates for students and assist with best interest determinations.

In addition to operating expenses and travel for these individuals, \$150,000 would be needed each year for materials and supplies, professional learning, and contracted services. The NDE would also want to ensure each facility continues to maintain individual principals, though it's unclear how or if funding currently allocated would transfer directly to the NDE, or if those individuals should be accounted for in this fiscal analysis.

These costs would be transferred to the Department of Education.
