This bill will change the number of separate juvenile court judges. The bill has the emergency clause, and is operative on July 1, 2007.

STATE IMPACT: This bill increases the number of separate juvenile court judges from three to four judges in counties having at least two hundred thousand inhabitants but less than four hundred thousand inhabitants (only Lancaster County).
